Talladega County Enhances the Efficiency of Historic Buildings

Talladega County, Alabama is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to preserve a local building on the National Register of Historic Places, while renovating it for the 21st century. Through these retrofits, Talladega County **will lower its greenhouse gas emissions, reduce electricity consumption and corresponding utility bills and improve the atmosphere in and around these buildings.**

Talladega County is using EECBG funding to ...

- Install new building automation system controls and replace existing HVAC equipment with high-efficiency HVAC equipment at the Talladega County Courthouse, **significantly reducing the operating cost of the oldest working courthouse in Alabama.**
- Retrofit the Courthouse with **high-efficiency lighting systems using induction technology**, further reducing energy consumption at the facility.

Impact on Talladega County, AL

- \$342,700 in EECBG funding
- 1 job to be created or retained
- 221,162 kilowatt-hours of energy conserved annually
- 155 metric tons of CO₂e emissions avoided
