Berkeley Continues to Take Climate Actions

The City of Berkeley, California is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to **enhance energy services and standards and reduce costs of energy retrofits for residential and nonresidential properties**. The City is also taking steps to prepare local residents for green job opportunities through their highly-visible EECBG educational programming.

Berkeley is using EECBG funding to ...

- Provide rebates to residential and commercial property owners and their tenants **to defray capital costs associated with energy efficiency improvements**.
- **Partner with Pacific Gas & Electric to give rebates** for home performance testing, home energy rating and qualified improvements to participating customers.
- Stimulate demand for vendor and labor capacity in the local energy services sector, **fostering a green economy for the future**.

Impact on Berkeley, CA

- \$1 million in EECBG funding
- 18 jobs to be created or retained
- 658 metric tons of CO₂e emissions prevented in the first year
- \$277,264 in additional funds leveraged
