Riverside County Invests in Renewable Generation

Riverside County, California is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding **to build a more sustainable future** by adding renewable electricity capacity, reducing energy consumption and developing strategies for further sustainability improvements.

Riverside County is using EECBG funding to ...

- Install **three new renewable energy projects** that will reduce greenhouse gas emissions and lower monthly utility bills.
- Retrofit buildings with high-efficiency lighting, new HVAC equipment, energy-efficient windows, and **insulated bay doors on fire stations**. In addition, Riverside County will **further reduce energy consumption** by replacing traffic signals and street name signs with LED retrofits.
- **Plan for future sustainability measures and cost reductions** by creating a regional greenhouse gas inventory, developing a comprehensive Climate Action Plan, and developing compliance plans for state-wide environmental programs.

Impact on Riverside County, CA

- \$6.6 million in EECBG funding
- 72 jobs to be created or retained
- 34,337 metric tons of CO₂e emissions saved
- 258 kW of renewable energy capacity installed
