South San Francisco Committed to Reducing GHG Emissions

The City of South San Francisco, California is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to create sustainability initiatives within the community that **will reduce greenhouse gas emissions and promote energy efficiency for years to come**. By conducting a Community-wide Greenhouse Emissions Inventory, the City is creating a foundation for understanding local contributions to climate change and setting targets for reducing local emissions.

South San Francisco is using EECBG funding to ...

- **Install 200 solar panels on the rooftop of City Hall**, which will generate enough renewable electricity to reduce the building's annual electric bill by approximately 69%.
- Conduct lighting retrofits at municipal buildings, **which will save \$72,700 annually in electricity costs**.
- **Establish a home efficiency program** that will provide roughly 50-70 low- and moderate-income South San Francisco homeowners with grants and loans for investments in energy efficient products.
