## Collier County Fights Climate Change and Saves Money

Collier County, Florida is maximizing the benefits of its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding by **funding a broad scope of county-wide programs** that will make both immediate and long-term impacts on the County's energy consumption and carbon footprint.

### Collier County is using EECBG funding to ...

- Improve energy conservation in county facilities and utility stations that result in **a direct financial benefit to taxpayers and ratepayers**, including a mixture of lighting and mechanical improvements.
- Reduce delays for vehicle travel on multiple roadways, resulting in corresponding **reduction in fuel consumption**.
- **Improve County planning by implementing a green building codes and inspection training program** and a master mobility plan to manage growth in a sustainable, financially feasible and environmentally responsible manner.

### Impact on Collier County, FL

- \$3 million in EECBG funding
- 35 jobs to be created or retained
- 6,221 metric tons of CO<sub>2</sub>e emissions prevented
- 373,240 gallons of gasoline reduced
