## Green Bay Promotes Community Energy Saving Improvements

The City of Green Bay, Wisconsin is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to become a more energy efficient community. From replacing architectural lighting on bridges with energy efficient lighting to weatherizing and upgrading City buildings, to providing homeowners rebate incentives to implement energy audits, **Green Bay has become a leader in creating a sustainable “green” community.**

### Green Bay is using EECBG funding to ...

- **Create green jobs** by contracting for a comprehensive energy and greenhouse gas audit of twenty municipal buildings and fleet vehicles, and **hiring a Sustainability Coordinator** to assist the community with technical planning and public outreach activities.
- Complete energy saving retrofits and upgrades in City buildings, including **improvements in weatherization, mechanical, HVAC, solar light tubes and lighting systems.**
- **Provide rebates to homeowners for home energy audits** that encourage gaining knowledge about home energy usage and the benefits of installing energy saving retrofits.

### Impact on Green Bay, WI

- \$1,003,000 in EECBG funding
- 67,717 megawatt-hours of electricity saved
- 24 jobs to be created or retained
- 56,998 metric tons of CO<sub>2</sub>e emissions prevented
