Kauai County Commits to Clean Energy

Kauai County, Hawai'i is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to **build a new ultra-efficient fire station powered by photovoltaic cells**. This solar power array, the County's first renewable generation system, will allow Kauai County to lead by example in implementing energy efficiency and clean energy projects that help to protect Hawai'i's environment.

Kauai County is using EECBG funding to ...

- Partner with the National Renewable Energy Laboratory during construction of the new Kaiakea Fire Station to **conduct an engineering review that will identify opportunities to enhance energy efficiency at the facility**.
- Design and install a solar photovoltaic system on the new Kaiakea Fire Station, **to power the new fire station with zero-emission energy**.

Impact on Kauai County, HI

- \$267,900 in EECBG funding
- 7 jobs to be created or retained
- 30 kilowatts of renewable generation capacity installed
- 58,683 pounds of CO₂e prevented annually
