## Noblesville Installs Energy Saving Street Lights

The City of Noblesville, Indiana is using its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to continue its efforts to become an Indiana Comprehensive Local Environmental Action Network (CLEAN) Community. Through the installation of sustainable, energy conserving LED lighting in existing streetlights, **Noblesville is moving closer to attaining its goal of changing all street lighting and traffic signals to more energy efficient lighting by the year 2020.**

**Noblesville is using EECBG funding to ...**

- **Install new LED lighting and equipment to save energy and maintenance costs** in downtown Noblesville business areas and on a section of Indiana SR 37.
- **Create green jobs** by contracting for the replacement of 175 watt metal Halide and high pressure sodium lights with retrofit LED lighting.
- **Share information about the environmental and financial benefits of energy efficiency** with the community through interviews and programs on Hometown Television Channel 19, Noblesville's local cable channel.
