St. Clair Shores Educates Residents on Energy Efficiency

The City of St. Clair Shores, Michigan is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to develop a comprehensive plan **encouraging the adoption of new efficiency and conservation technologies that will reduce energy consumption and pollution.** All energy and cost savings will be monitored, quantified, and reported to the City's residents.

St. Clair Shores is using EECBG funding to ...

- Make energy retrofits to several of city-owned buildings including the Library, Department of Public Works, Fire Stations, Civic Arena, and Police Department. **Retrofits include replacing HVAC systems, large motors, changing of lighting ballasts, and application of Low-E film to exterior windows.**
- Complete the City's non-motorized pedestrian pathway system, which will **encourage residents and visitors to travel through the city on foot or by bicycle, saving energy and reducing exhaust emissions.**
- Renovate one Staff bathroom in City Hall by installing a shower and changing facility **to encourage municipal employees to commute to work on foot or by bicycle.**

- \$544,000 in EECBG funding
- 10 jobs to be created or retained
- 1,631 megawatt-hours of electricity conserved
- 1,263 metric tons of CO₂e emissions prevented annually
