Westland Helps Residents Improve Energy Efficiency

The City of Westland, MI is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to make municipal buildings more energy-efficient, assist low-income households in reducing their energy costs and promote no-cost, self-sustaining energy conservation activities that engage the community. These activities coincide with other non-EECBG-supported projects to **help protect the environment and promote a sustainable future.**

Westland is using EECBG funding to ...

- **Reduce energy consumption in municipal facilities** including the Mike Modano Ice Arena, Bailey Recreation Center and Police Station through the replacement of inefficient HVAC systems and boilers.
- Leverage federal Neighborhood Stabilization Program funding to **rehabilitate homes in blighted neighborhoods by retrofitting them with energy efficient equipment.**
- Consider offering a trade-in program for low-income residents to **recycle their old incandescent light bulbs in exchange for free, efficient fluorescent lights** that will help reduce energy costs.

- \$731,100 in EECBG funding
- 9 jobs to be created or retained
- 3,129 megawatt-hours of energy conserved
- 2,416 metric tons of CO₂e emissions prevented
