Missoula Leverages Funding with a Revolving Loan Fund

The City of Missoula, Montana is partnering with Johnson Controls to leverage its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding through an **Energy Savings Performance Contract, which guarantees energy efficiency savings at two targeted municipal buildings.** By supplementing this effort to reduce energy consumption at local government buildings with a revolving loan fund and free residential energy audits to Missoula residents, the City is working to reduce emissions throughout the community.

Missoula is using EECBG funding to ...

- **Create a revolving loan fund** that will help homeowners, business owners, non-profits and others to implement energy efficiency and conservation measures.
- **Offer grants to the public to conduct energy audits**, expanding upon a successful pilot program started in 2008 that resulted in lower homeowner electricity bills.
- **Electrify the city's vehicle fleet**, starting with the conversion of municipal vehicles to plug-in hybrids and all-electric vehicles.

Impact on Missoula, MT

- \$680,400 in EECBG funding
- 9 jobs created or saved
- 3,150 megawatt-hours of energy conserved
- 3,876 metric tons of CO₂e emissions prevented
