Chapel Hill Helps Residents to Improve Efficiency

The Town of Chapel Hill, North Carolina is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to start a **comprehensive, community-wide sustainability program** aimed at lowering energy consumption, reducing greenhouse gas emissions and minimizing utility bills through measures in municipal facilities and personal residences. These actions will be coordinated with local utilities, non-profits, state offices and the Federal government to maximize their effectiveness.

Chapel Hill is using EECBG funding to ...

- **Implement a residential energy efficiency program** that features outreach and education, financial incentives for audits and retrofits, and quality assurance and controls to achieve maximum program efficacy and participation.
- **Provide financial incentives** for residential energy audits and retrofits of energy-efficient appliances in order to encourage the adoption of energy efficiency and renewable energy technologies.
- **Retrofit municipal buildings** with a focus on energy-efficient lighting and energy management systems for Town facilities, as well as high-efficiency refrigerator and window air conditioning unit replacements in Town-owned Public Housing units.

Impact on Chapel Hill, NC

- \$554,900 in EECBG funding
- 5 jobs to be created or retained
- An estimated 1,217,842 kilowatt-hours of energy conserved
- An estimated 1,084 metric tons of CO₂e emissions prevented
