Hoboken Enhances Energy Efficiency for Local Non-Profits

The City of Hoboken, New Jersey is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to **rehabilitate the local Multi Service Center, which provides essential services to low- and moderate-income individuals**. Improvements to the building will focus on increasing the building's efficiency, which will reduce greenhouse gases and lower operational costs for the non-profits based out of the facility.

Hoboken is using EECBG funding to...

- **Replace the HVAC system in the Multi Service Center, which has been non-operational for many years**, ensuring that non-profits based out of the building are no longer dependant upon window air conditioners.
- Leverage **Community Development Block Grant funding** from Hudson County to complete these renovations.
- **Provide a more comfortable working atmosphere for the non-profit organizations** operating out of the Multi Service Center, including Hoboken Family Planning, Hoboken Day Care 100, Hoboken Organization Against Poverty & Economic Stress (HOPES), and the City's Comprehensive Program for the Elderly.
