## Morris County Improves Energy Efficiency and Public Awareness

Morris County, New Jersey is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to lay the groundwork for future investments by **integrating energy and sustainable site development concepts into the County Planning Board's Master Plan**. By conducting significant energy audits and energy efficiency retrofits to municipal buildings alongside this planning effort, EECBG funding is helping Morris County reach its energy and emissions-reduction goals.

### Morris County is using EECBG funding to ...

- Install **energy-efficient lighting and Building Management Systems** in multiple county buildings, enabling more efficient energy utilization through automated controls.
- **Raise public awareness of potential efficiency measures** by creating a public energy efficiency & conservation strategy, developing a greenhouse gas emissions inventory for public buildings, improving recycling marketing efforts and launching a new mass transit awareness campaign.
- Develop a smart vehicle routing system for recycling pickup vehicles that will directly reduce the county's transportation demand and support the main goals of **positioning the county as a leader in energy efficiency and recycling**.

### Impact on Morris County, NJ

- \$4.2 million in EECBG funding
- 113,247,006 kilowatt-hours of energy saved
- 75,290 metric tons of CO2e emissions avoided
