Trenton Conducts Comprehensive Audits to Identify Energy Savings

The City of Trenton, New Jersey is working to improve the City's environmental performance with its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding. **Trenton is significantly reducing the City's annual energy consumption and lowering associated greenhouse gas emissions** through upgrades to aging municipal buildings and by taking steps to identify other possible energy and cost savings.

Trenton is using EECBG funding to ...

- Establish an Energy Efficiency and Conservation Strategy and **conduct investment-grade energy audits of municipal buildings.**
- **Replace inefficient lighting systems** with high-efficiency bulbs and fixtures, as well as occupancy sensors, to ensure electricity is being used appropriately.
- Upgrade the HVAC (Heating, Ventilation, and Air-Conditioning) systems in many buildings, **replacing existing units with cleaner, more energy-efficient, technology.**
