Doña Ana County Promotes Efficiency and Conservation

Dona Aña County, New Mexico is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to **install electricity-saving devices throughout the county that will reduce carbon emissions and utility bills**. By investing in low-cost and high-yield activities, such as tinting windows to lower cooling costs, Dona Aña County is enhancing the impact of its federal funding.

Dona Aña County is using EECBG funding to ...

- Replace existing parking lot light fixtures with LED light fixtures, supporting Dona Ana County's goal of **reducing the county's energy use by 20 %**.
- Replace existing light fixtures with **high-efficiency light fixtures** in four county buildings.
- Conduct **audits of existing HVAC and lighting equipment in all county buildings**, to identify improvements that can increase energy efficiency, including determining if motion sensors and timers can help reduce energy usage.

Impact on Dona Aña County, NM

- \$446,900 in EECBG funding
- 2 jobs to be created or retained
- More than 670,899 kilowatt-hours of electricity saved
- 376 metric tons of CO₂e prevented
