Westchester County Creates Green Jobs

Westchester County, New York is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to implement a wide-ranging Energy Conservation, Greenhouse Gas Inventory and Scoping Plan in order to maximize the impact of its federal funding. As Westchester County continues to enact this comprehensive sustainability strategy, the County **will lock-in environmental and financial benefits for decades to come.**

Westchester County is using EECBG funding to ...

- **Provide up to 1,500 homes with residential energy efficiency audits** conducted by contractors certified by the New York State Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA).
- **Develop a web-based GHG reporting program** that would be available to all sectors – business, local government and education – to collect and report yearly progress, as well as to continue to communicate the use of EECBG funding to the public.
- Deploy building management systems and energy efficiency upgrades such as new lighting systems that will **generate annual energy savings north of \$735,000.**
