Kettering Builds Capacity for Energy Efficiency Upgrades

The City of Kettering, Ohio is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to **reduce electricity consumption at city buildings** while simultaneously **aiding residents in making efficiency improvements of their own**. By doing so, Kettering is taking major steps to reduce operating expenditures while promoting a more sustainable and healthier community.

Kettering is using EECBG funding to...

- Upgrade a 40-year old local government building with new ultra-efficient mechanical systems and energy-saving window glazing to **achieve LEED certification**.
- Purchase equipment to conduct energy audits and offer **free energy audits** for homeowners, to help them determine and reduce their own energy consumption.
- **Offer grants to homeowners to improve energy efficiency** by purchasing new storm windows and doors, wall and attic insulation, and replacement or modification of inefficient HVAC equipment.

Impact on Kettering, OH

- \$520,200 in EECBG funding
- 39 jobs to be created or retained
- 151,896 kilowatt-hours of electricity saved
- 13,116 metric tons of CO2e reduced
- \$165,185 in utility bill savings
