## Tooele County Upgrades Efficiency

Tooele County, Utah is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to embark on a Capital Improvement Energy Efficiency Retrofit Program that includes replacing outdated HVAC chillers on the County Building. These improvements will **reduce energy consumption, avoid carbon dioxide emissions and generate taxpayer utility savings of over \$6,433 per year.**

Tooele County is using EECBG funding to ...

- **Replace existing HVAC chillers at the County Building with an energy efficient system** that will be scheduled to operate only during times when the facility is occupied.
- Convert constant volume reheat systems to low electricity-consuming variable systems at the County Building, **allowing the facility's fan system to operate fewer hours each day.**

### Impact on Tooele County, UT

- \$225,000 in EECBG funding
- 10 jobs to be created or retained
- 441 metric tons of CO<sub>2</sub>e prevented
- \$178,000 of additional funding leveraged
