Waukesha Installs Energy Efficient Lights and Windows

The City of Waukesha, Wisconsin is utilizing its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funding to **upgrade lights and windows to high-efficiency, long-lasting models** that will lower electricity bills and capital expenses for replacement. The City of Waukesha's Department of Public Works will install these improvements using EECBG funding.

Waukesha is using EECBG funding to ...

- Retrofit street lights with **LED and induction technologies** which cut energy costs in half and do not need replacement for five to ten times as long as traditional incandescent bulbs.
- **Replace windows in older municipal buildings with models that have superior insulation qualities**, reducing the need for costly heating during the winter and air conditioning during the summer.

Impact on Waukesha, WI

- \$657,400 in EECBG funding
- 7 jobs to be created or retained
- 800,277 kilowatt-hours of energy saved annually
- 1,024 metric tons of CO₂e prevented
